

**BEAUMONT CARE PARTNERS, LLC  
CLINICAL INTEGRATION PROGRAM  
NON-EXCLUSIVITY AND CONFLICTS POLICY**

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Pursuant to the designation in Section 5 of the Clinical Integration Network Physician Participation Agreement between Beaumont Care Partners, LLC (“BCP”) and the physician participants (each a “Physician Practice”), the BCP is a non-exclusive provider network.

Each Physician Practice may provide professional medical and related services directly or through third party payers (collectively, “Purchasers”) apart from its participation in BCP, and Physician Practice may contract with other clinically integrated networks or managed care arrangements (collectively, “Networks”).

However, Physician Practice acknowledges that the terms of any Purchaser Agreement entered into by BCP on Physician Practice’s behalf with a particular Purchaser for a particular product shall receive priority in the event that the Physician Practice participates in a similar agreement with the same Purchaser through its participation in another Network, as long as the Physician Practice’s BCP participation was first in time. In cases of potential conflict (i.e., including but not limited to similarity of a plan’s agreement for product, risk structure or incentives) the Board of Managers will review the same and make a determination.

For purposes of clarification, in the event that Physician Practice dually participates in one or more arrangements with the same Purchaser through one or more Networks, the arrangement executed first in time will control.

Notwithstanding the foregoing, the BCP Board of Directors may grant exceptions to the BCP’s priority as set forth in this Non-Exclusivity and Conflicts Policy on a case-by-case basis.
